#### What is Activated Charcoal:

- ✓ Activated charcoal is made from heating high carbon sources (e.g. wood, coconut shell, bamboo, olive stones, coal) to very high temperatures in a low oxygen environment.
- ✓ The end result is an extremely porous carbon that can bind many substances.
- ✓ The properties of activated charcoal are determined by its original source.

#### **Fact**

The surface area of activated charcoal is enormous! One teaspoon (5ml) of activated charcoal has a surface area of between 1 and 2 hectares  $(10,000 \text{ m}^2 - 20,000 \text{ m}^2)$ .



VetiCoal is a black paste containing 50% activated charcoal, it can be used as a nutritional aid in the management of:



Flatulence



Absorption of toxins\*



**Digestive Disturbances** 



Bloating/abdominal discomfort

#### How does VetiCoal work:

When activated charcoal is ingested, it binds to toxins, intestinal gas or other noxious substances in the gastrointestinal tract and prevents their absorption into the body. It can then be excreted in the faeces.

#### **VetiCoal** as an absorbent for poisons:

The absorption of poison by VetiCoal is entirely dependent on:

- ✓ The type of poison.
- ✓ The time since ingestion of the poison.
- ✓ An individual risk assessment.

VetiCoal can be used to treat poisonings; however, it should be noted that when using activated charcoal to treat animals following poisoning, the administration rate and frequency should be assessed on a case by case basis. The specific type, quantity and timing of toxin ingestion should be considered when administering VetiCoal. Always contact your local poisons information center for advice and information specific to the individual case.

<sup>\*</sup>In some circumstances VetiCoal can be used to treat ingestion of toxins, but this is very toxin specific and advise should always be sought from the local poisons information centre.

VetiCoal is a complementary feeding stuff formulated by Veterinarians as a nutritional support in the management of bloating, gas and absorption of toxins.

#### Directions for Use

**VetiCoal** can be fed directly to the pet using the syringe provided or can be mixed into food. To provide 1g/kg BW activated charcoal, 2ml/kg **VetiCoal** should be fed. The feeding rate of **VetiCoal** to cats and dogs is shown in the table below. Always ensure access to fresh drinking water. **VetiCoal** can be fed to puppies and kittens from 12 weeks of age. Pets should be supervised while feeding **VetiCoal**.

#### Ingredients:

If your pet is pregnant or nursing consult your veterinary surgeon before giving this product. DO NOT induce vomiting following administration of **VetiCoal**. Advice on use of **VetiCoal** in cases of poisoning should always be sought from your veterinary surgeon. **VetiCoal** feeding may result in blackening of the faeces, which is normal. If dark faeces persist beyond cessation of feeding, veterinary advise should be sought. If symptoms continue consult your veterinary surgeon.
